General Criteria for Author guidelines

Component	Description
Title	The title, in 25 words or less, clearly illustrates the presentation, fits with the theme and connects with the main topics.
Introduction/ Background with an appropriate Literature Review	The introductory section typically incorporates the research's contextual backdrop and/or its motivational underpinnings, accompanied by an overview of pertinent scholarly literature.
Research Problem/s, Objective/s	Research problem/s should exhibit logical coherence. Objectives must be unambiguous, scientifically rigorous, and feasibly attainable through the prescribed methodologies.
Methodology	This section (If available) generally includes information on the following. The type of research, sample selection, data collection procedures, analysis methods, and the rationale behind utilizing specific tools or materials. This facilitates the critical assessment of a study's overall validity and reliability. Whether employing quantitative, qualitative, or mixed methods, their appropriateness to the research question and robust design are equally acceptable.

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Results and Discussion

In this section, a summary/ overview of the study's findings is provided with a preference for using descriptive figures or tables rather than textual explanations. Furthermore, it is essential to elucidate the discussion of results within the framework of prior research and widely acknowledged knowledge in the respective field.

Conclusion and Recommendations

This section deliberates on the conclusions and recommendations that can be inferred from the findings and the preceding discussions in the other sections.

The abstract adheres to submission guidelines, being wellstructured within a maximum of two pages. It furnishes ample details for conference attendees to ascertain its pertinence to their specific areas of interest. Consideration is given to the study's originality and creativity.
